Job Description - School Social Liaison

The Licensed School Social Worker provides direct and indirect social work services to students experiencing social, emotional and/or behavioral problems that interfere with their performance in school, and facilitates communication among school, home and community providers.

RELATED SERVICES:

- Serve on student support teams and committees such as RTI and PBIS Meetings.
- Assessment and counseling (group, individual and/or family) if and when appropriate.
- Assisting in developing positive behavioral intervention strategies.
- Mobilizing family, school, and community resources to enable the child to learn as effectively as possible in his or her educational program

SERVICES TO STUDENTS:

- Provide instruction to K-12 students related to academic and social/emotional wellbeing.
- Provide support and advocacy to and for students relating to their academic and social/emotional wellbeing.

SERVICES TO PARENT/FAMILIES:

- Assisting parents in accessing and utilizing school and community resources.

SERVICES TO SCHOOL PERSONNEL:

- Providing staff with essential information to better understand factors (cultural, societal, economic, familial, health, etc.) affecting a student's performance and behavior.
- Assisting the development and implementation of staff in-service training programs.

SCHOOL-COMMUNITY LIAISON:

- Maintain an ongoing liaison partnership with community agencies and other resources to meet student needs; refers parents and students to agencies when appropriate.
- Obtaining and coordinating community resources to meet students' needs.
- Assisting the school with family outreach.

SERVICES TO DISTRICTS:

- Support social and emotional programming for students K-12.
- Assist the district in establishing and maintaining services and programs for students with at risk behaviors such as: truancy, delayed graduation / drop-out, etc.
